Dear Friends and Easter people,

Jesus is the Great 'I am': Bread of Life; Light of the World; Gate; Good Shepherd; Resurrection; Way, Truth and Life; True Vine.

And I wonder how his disciples heard Jesus' words in our Gospel passage today – all this talk of abiding, and branches bearing fruit, of pruning, and love. But in

whatever way those early followers may have heard and experienced Jesus' words, we today can see them for the radical, challenging, and inclusive message they bear.

And it is all about love: the radical death-defying love of Jesus, who is the Saviour of this world. It is about a love so amazing and so divine and so limitless that it continues to pour forth in bread and wine, Word and water, and Spiritwind. In a world so broken and bruised, this love of God made real in Jesus and extended to us through his dying and rising again, is the only antidote to death and darkness.

Abide in me, Jesus says. Be re-assured! I ever abide in you. This is a given; this is the work I have accomplished; nothing can take it away from you. And he adds, you, my friends and disciples, you also have work to do, for those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit,...' We are to bear fruit.
