Dear Friends and People of God,

As quoted from Isaiah's prophecy in today's Gospel reading: The voice of one crying in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight. Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be made low, and the crooked shall be made straight and the rough ways made smooth; and all flesh shall see the salvation of God.'

What a promise, what assurance, great cause for rejoicing.

But what a different tone in the words of the prophecy of our Old Testament reading from the prophet Malachi: 'The Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple. Who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears? He is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap.'

Searching, challenging, foreseeing judgment and change Promise and assurance - judgement and change. That is exactly what Advent presents to us.

And our Gospel reading underscores it: We cannot get to the baby Jesus of Christmas without checkpoint John. And he asks us to repent. To get our lives in order and to get our common life ordered for the wellbeing of all.

Repentance, in Greek, metanoia, means to change our whole worldview. Change, because, my friends, we are so often less than what and who God intends us to be.

This change, this transformation, is about embracing the one whose name is salvation, Jesus, the one who is 'God

saves' and 'God with us'. And as we embrace Him, Jesus, we, too are embraced - embraced with love and change and growth and the transformation of the lives we are already living, from glory into glory.

'And the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together, for the mouth of the Lord has spoken it.'
