Dear Friends and people of God, dear Easter People,

Alleluia, Christ is risen! He is risen indeed. Alleluia.

'I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him.' Peter's words from our reading from the Acts of the Apostles. Said in response to his own mind being blown right open by God's desire to bring all the nations home to him.

Today we celebrate the end of fear! Today we celebrate an empty tomb! Today we celebrate that death holds no longer any power over us. Today we celebrate Jesus, our life and our salvation.

They had taken His lifeless body from the cross and carried it into the tomb. But on the third day, He rose again, the victorious Son of God – just as Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James and the other women find visiting the tomb, the stone rolled away and the tomb empty, idle talk for some; just as Peter finds running to the tomb, stooping and looking in, seeing the linen cloths by themselves...

We, too, this morning, have an empty tomb, a broken seal, a stone rolled away from the door of the grave. We won't find the bones of the Son of God anywhere! He lives and He reigns to all eternity! This turns night into day, despair into hope, and death into life. For alleluia, Christ is risen, he is risen indeed, alleluia.

God's angel rolls the stone away not to let Jesus out - but to let us in - to allow us to see that Christ's promises are true, for alleluia, he is risen! Those same words that echoed and reechoed in that Easter tomb still fill the emptiness of our world today: He is risen, indeed, alleluia.

The tomb has become a trumpet proclaiming the victory of life over death, and the continuation of Christ's presence and mission in this world - first in Jerusalem, and then to the ends of the earth.
